

Star Boxing's Ali "The Hurricane" Oubaali (22-3, 18KO's) last fought on August 6th at the Aviator Sports and Recreation Center in Brooklyn, NY. On this night he was taking on the tough Chris Fernandez (15-5-1, 9KO's) on that week's ESPN2's "Wednesday Night Fights" main event.

Oubaali simply had too much fire power for Fernandez on this night as he continuously fired off seven and eight punch combinations to both the body and head from the opening bell until the fight was finally stopped in the 8th round. Since joining Star Boxing's roster the France Native, now living in Brooklyn, NY, has gone 3-0, 2KO's and has seemed to become increasingly better and more dangerous with each fight. It was the second time Oubaali was featured on ESPN2, and after such a dominating performance he surely throws his name into the mix of top 140 lb. fighters in the world.

CEO of Star Boxing Joe DeGuardia was extremely happy with his jr. welterweight's performance. "That's what boxing is all about. He is like a throw back fighter from the 50's. He always comes to fight. He throws a lot of punches and puts constant pressure on his opponents. He throws beautiful combinations both to the body and head. He is quick, he is powerful, and he is always coming forward, I have a really good feeling about Ali. I think he is a force in the jr. welterweight division and that he definitely turned a lot of heads with this performance," stated DeGuardia.
